

Commentary on the Gospel for Tue, Dec 2nd 2014

It is said that an average person has around 60,000 thoughts per day. It means that he thinks and thinks and beats around those 60,000. Among those 60,000 thoughts, often 95% of them are negative thoughts. In the words of St. Paul, they are thoughts of fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these (Gal 5:20-21). But when the Messiah comes and establishes his kingdom here on earth, you can't live with these negative thoughts. You cannot be subjected to the works of flesh.
