

Commentary on the Gospel for Thu, Dec 11th 2014

A microphone amplifies the weak voice and makes it louder than the strongest voice. A motor bike can make a slow person faster than the world's fastest runner. Yes, God's kingdom can make an insignificant person greater than the world's greatest person. This is the message of today.
