

Commentary on the Gospel for Thu, Dec 18th 2014

Advent is a time of expectation. We are in expectation. There is expectation at home for the birth of a new baby. There is anxious expectation for a baby for nine months. Expectation is the theme of today's liturgy. Yes, a son will be born in the family of David. He will be a king like David. He will reign and govern wisely. He will do only what is just and right. Justice will be his hallmark. This is fulfilled by the birth of Jesus who was born to the descendant of David as Joseph was his father. Not only Jesus would be just but his father Joseph was also a just and righteous man. Justice also means not gossiping, not maligning one's good name, not assassinating one's character and not ridiculing the weak and putting them into shame.
