

Commentary on the Gospel for Sat, Jan 31st 2015

Today's gospel reading doesn't exactly give us a warm, fuzzy, Disney ending. "By faith, Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son,

of whom it was said, Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name." God, you're kidding, right?

This can often times be our response when God asks us to do something big. Can he seriously be asking us to walk through this storm and pain? What kind of "good and loving" God would do that?
