First Reading: Jon 3:1-10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time:

"Set out for the great city of Ninevech,
and amounce to it the message that I will tell you."

So Jonah made ready and went to Ninevech,
according to the LORD's bidding.

Now Ninevels was an enormously large city;
it took three days to go through it.

Jonah began his journey through the city,
