

# Readings: ST. THERESA OF JESUS, Virgin and Church Doctor, Memorial

First Reading: Rom 1:16-25

Brothers and sisters:

I am not ashamed of the Gospel.  
It is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes:  
for Jew first, and then Greek.  
For in it is revealed the righteousness of God from faith to faith;

as it is written, "The one who is righteous by faith will live."

The wrath of God is indeed being revealed from heaven  
against every impiety and wickedness  
of those who suppress the truth by their wickedness.  
For what can be known about God is evident to them,  
because God made it evident to them.  
Ever since the creation of the world,  
his invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity

have been able to be understood and perceived in what he has made.

As a result, they have no excuse;  
for although they knew God  
they did not accord him glory as God or give him thanks.  
Instead, they became vain in their reasoning,  
and their senseless minds were darkened.  
While claiming to be wise, they became fools  
and exchanged the glory of the immortal God  
for the likeness of an image of mortal man

or of birds or of four-legged animals or of snakes.

Therefore, God handed them over to impurity  
through the lusts of their hearts  
for the mutual degradation of their bodies.  
They exchanged the truth of God for a lie  
and revered and worshiped the creature rather than the creator,

who is blessed forever. Amen.

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Gospel Introduction

In today's gospel Jesus reacts against pious Jews who stress the observance of the externals - laws, rules, customs - without inspiration and motivation from inside. Most probably the Pharisees were sincere in practicing these outward regulations, but they easily gave the ones practicing them the conviction of saving themselves

through them. In fact, in today's world too externals count heavily. People buy things for their wrappings. Appearances are often all that matters... It is not the shining cup that matters but the contents. Indeed, the contents must be first-rate.

Gospel Reading: Lk 11:37-41

As Jesus was speaking, a Pharisee asked him to have a meal with him. So he went and sat at table. The Pharisee then wondered why Jesus did not first wash his hands before dinner. But the Lord said to him, "So then, you Pharisees, you clean the outside of the cup and the dish, but inside yourselves you are full of greed and evil. Fools!

He who made the outside, also made the inside. But according to you, by the mere giving of alms everything is made clean."
