He went out and began to weep bitterly.

When it was morning, all the chief priests and the elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death. They bound him, led him away,

and handed him over to Pilate, the governor

Then Judas, his betrayer, seeing that Jesus had been condemned, deeply regrented what he had done. He returned the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priess and elders, saying, "I have sinned in betraying innocent blood." They said, "What is that to us?" "What is that to us?

and led him off to crucify him

As they were going out, they met a Cyrenian named Simon; this man they pressed into service

to carry his cross.

And when they came to a place called Golgotha
—which means Place of the Skull—
they gave Jesus wine to drink mixed with gall.
But when he had tasted it, he refused to drink.
After they had crucified him,
they divided his garments by casing lots;
then they sat down and kept watch over him there.
And they placed over his bead the written charge against him:
This is Jesus, the King of the Jews.
Two revolutionaries were crucified with him,
one on his right and the other on his left.
Those passing by revited him, shaking their heads and saying,
"You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days,
save yourself, if you are the Son of God,
and come down from the cross!"
Likewise the chief priests with the scribes and elders mocked him and said,
"He saved others; he cannot save himself.
So he is the king of Israe!!
Let him come down from the cross now,
and we will believe in him.
He trusted in God;
let him deliver him now if he wants him.
For he said, I am the Son of God."

The revolutionaries who were crucified with him

also kept abusing him in the same way.

From noon onward, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, Iema sabachtham?" which neams, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Some of the bystanders who heard it said, "This one is calling for Elijah." Immediately one of them ran to get a sponge; he soaked it in wine, and putting it on a reed, gave it to him to drink.

But the rest said, "Wait, Ied us see if Elijah comes to save him."
But Jesus cried out again in a loud voice,

and gave up his spirit.

Here all kneel and pause for a short time.

And behold, the veil of the sanctuary
was torn in two from top to bottom.
The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened,
and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised.
And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection,
they entered the holy city and appeared to many.
The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus
feared greatly when they saw the carthquake
and all that was happening, and they said,
"Trily, this was the Son of God!"
There were many women there, looking on from a distance,
who had followed Jesus from Gallie, ministering to him.
Among them were Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph,

and the mother of the sons of Zebedee

When it was evening,
there came a rich man from Arimuthea named Joseph,
who was himself a disciple of Jesus.
He went to Platea and asked for the body of Jesus;
then Plate ordered it to be handed over.
Taking the body, Joseph wrapped it in clean linen
and laid it in his new tomb that he had hewn in the rock.
Then he rolled a huge stone across the entrainee to the tomb and departed.
But Mary Magdalene and the other Mary
remained sitting there, facing the tomb.
The next day, the one following the day of preparation,
the chief priests and the Planisees
gathered before Plate and said,
"Sir, we remember that this impostor while still alive said,
'After three days! I will be raised up.'
Give orders, then, that the grave be secured until the third day,
leat his disciples come and steal him and say to the people,
'He has been raised from the dead!

Flate said to them,
"The guard is yours:
go, secure it as best you can."
So they went and secured the tomb

by fixing a seal to the stone and setting the guard.
